1. Purpose

This document is designed to help CDR participants — including data holders, accredited (and unaccredited) data recipients and other providers engaging with the Consumer Data Right — readily locate and access the various iterations of the Competition and Consumer (Consumer Data Right) Rules (CDR Rules), as well as other key CDR legislative framework material (e.g. CDR designation instruments and CDR regulations) and related explanatory materials. This document is current as of 22 February 2024. It will be updated periodically with references to new CDR Rules amendments, CDR designation instruments and CDR regulations once they have come into force.

Current consolidated version of the CDR Rules



This will assist in finding the appropriate version of the CDR Rules for the issue you are exploring. For example, if you are interested in better understanding the current joint account rules, you may wish to review the Explanatory Statement accompanying version 3 of the CDR Rules.

4. Current version of Part IVD of the *Competition and Consumer Act*

Part IVD of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* (Cth) (CCA) also contains key CDR obligations, including the Privacy Safeguards. Similar to the process for finding the current version of the CDR Rules, the current version of Part IVD of the CCA can be found on the <u>Federal Register of Legislation</u>. As with the CDR Rules, the current version of the CCA should include the statement "In force", which will look like:



5. Previous amendments to Part IVD of the CCA

Note that not all amendments to the CCA are relevant to the CDR. The table below sets out amendments to the CCA that relate to the CDR and Part IVD that have been made since the introduction of Part IVD to the CCA in August 2019.

7. List of CDR Sector Designation Instruments

Every time a new sector is designated for inclusion in the CDR, this is affected by a formal designation instrument that outlines how the new sector is defined, including what classes of information are to be included in the CDR for that sector, who may hold that data, and any exclusions that may apply. Please see below a list of the CDR Designation Instruments for each of the 4 sectors that have currently been designated.
